First Legislative Day, Monday, April 6, 2020

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-12

On April 1, 2020, the 719th case of a novel coronavirus (“COVID-19”), was confirmed in the State of Oklahoma. As noted in a previous Executive Order, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has identified the potential public health threat posed by COVID-19 as “high” both globally and in the United States. In addition, on March 14, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national health emergency in the United States as a result of the national spread of COVID-19.

As COVID-19’s impact continues to evolve, it is important to take measures to protect all Oklahomans against this threat. Therefore, I believe, after consultation with numerous health experts within my administration, that it is now time to declare that a health emergency exists in the State of Oklahoma, and the provisions of the Act set forth in Oklahoma Statutes 63 O.S. Sections 6101 et seq. should be activated.

Therefore, I, J. Kevin Stitt, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, pursuant to the power vested in me by Section 2 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution, and 63 O.S. §§ 6101-6900 of the Oklahoma Statutes, specifically 63 O.S. § 6401, do hereby declare and order the following:

1. There is hereby declared a health emergency in the State of Oklahoma, as defined in 63 O.S. § 6104 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

2. The nature of the health emergency is the spread of COVID-19 both in the United States and the State of Oklahoma.

3. The political subdivisions of the State subject to this declaration are:

All 77 Oklahoma Counties

4. The conditions that have brought about the health emergency are the spread of COVID-19 in the United States and the State of Oklahoma, and its potential to sicken and threaten the life of a large number of our citizens.

5. The duration of this state health emergency shall be for thirty (30) days after the filing of this Executive Order.

6. The primary public health authority responding to the health emergency shall be the Oklahoma State Commissioner of Health.

7. By declaring this emergency, I hereby authorize and enforce the provisions of 63 O.S. § 6804.

8. For the duration of the state health emergency declared herein, neither the provisions of 63 O.S. §§ 1-504-1-506 nor any administrative rule, regulation or procedure pertaining to a state, county or municipal quarantine shall apply to personnel of the Oklahoma National Guard activated in support of the COVID-19 response in Oklahoma. In lieu of such requirements, the Adjutant General shall implement appropriate quarantine procedures, in

accordance with established Department of Defense protocols, applicable to all Oklahoma National Guard personnel activated during the COVID-19 response.

The foregoing Orders shall be effective until the end of thirty (30) days after the filing of this Order.

In addition, I hereby declare and order the following:

1. Pursuant to the power and authority vested in me by Section 7 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution, I hereby convoke the First Special Session of the 57th Legislature to convene at the State Capitol at 8:00am Central Daylight Time on the second business day following the date of this Order, for the sole purpose of concurring with or terminating this declaration of health emergency.

Copies of this Executive Order shall be distributed to the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma Senate, the Adjutant General of the Oklahoma National Guard, the Oklahoma State Commissioner of Health, the Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety and the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services who shall cause the provisions of this Order to be implemented by all appropriate agencies of State government.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Oklahoma to be affixed at Oklahoma City, this 2nd day of April, 2020.

Members of the Board:

The Constitution of the State of Oklahoma, Article X, Section 23, as last amended November 2, 2010, provides in pertinent part:

7. Up to three-eighths (3/8) of the balance at the beginning of the current fiscal year in the Constitutional Reserve Fund may be appropriated for the current fiscal year if the State Board of Equalization determines that a revenue failure has occurred with respect to the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury. In no event shall the amount of monies appropriated from the Constitutional Reserve Fund pursuant to this paragraph be in excess of the amount of the projected revenue failure in the General Revenue Fund, which total amount shall be computed by the State Board of Equalization, for the entire fiscal year.

...the Legislature shall provide that all appropriations shall be reduced to bring them within revenues actually collected, but all such reductions shall apply to each department, institution, board, commission or special appropriation made by the State Legislature in the ratio that its total appropriation for that fiscal year bears to the total of all appropriations from that fund for that fiscal year...

Statutory provisions of O.S. 62, § 34.49 further provides, in pertinent part:

F. In the event of a failure of revenue, the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall control the allotment to prevent obligations being incurred in excess of the revenue to be collected. However, within each state fund where a revenue failure occurs, the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall make all reductions apply to each state agency or special appropriation made by the State Legislature, in the ratio that its total appropriation for that fiscal year bears to the total of all appropriations for that fiscal year, as provided in Section 23 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution.

The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services has complied with these provisions, and the following report has been prepared in accordance with the procedures set forth above and any additional statutory responsibilities required of the Board. AMENDED EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-12

On April 30, 2020, the 3,618th case of a novel coronavirus (“COVID-19”), was confirmed in the State of Oklahoma. As noted in a previous Executive Order, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has identified the potential public health threat posed by COVID-19 as “high” both globally and in the United States. In addition, on March 14, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national health emergency in the United States as a result of the national spread of COVID-19.

As COVID-19’s impact continues to evolve, it is important to take measures to protect all Oklahomans against this threat. Therefore, I believe, after consultation with numerous health experts within my administration, that a health emergency continues to exist in the State of Oklahoma, and the provisions of the Act set forth in Oklahoma Statutes 63 O.S. Sections 6101 et seq. should continue to be activated.

Therefore, I, J. Kevin Stitt, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, pursuant to the power vested in me by Section 2 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution, and 63 O.S. §§ 6101-6900 of the Oklahoma Statutes, specifically 63 O.S. § 6401, do hereby declare and order the following:

1. There is hereby declared a health emergency in the State of Oklahoma, as defined in 63 O.S. § 6104 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
2. The nature of the health emergency is the spread of COVID-19 both in the United States and the State of Oklahoma.
3. The political subdivisions of the State subject to this declaration are:

All 77 Oklahoma Counties

4. The conditions that have brought about the health emergency are the spread of COVID-19 in the United States and the State of Oklahoma, and its potential to sicken and threaten the life of a large number of our citizens.
5. The duration of this state health emergency shall be for thirty (30) days after the filing of this Executive Order.
6. The primary public health authority responding to the health emergency shall be the Oklahoma State Commissioner of Health.
7. By declaring this emergency, I hereby authorize and enforce the provisions of 63 O.S. § 6804.
8. For the duration of the state health emergency declared herein, neither the provisions of 63 O.S. §§ 1-504-1-506 nor any administrative rule, regulation or procedure pertaining to a state, county or municipal

quarantine shall apply to personnel of the Oklahoma National Guard activated in support of the COVID-19 response in Oklahoma. In lieu of such requirements, the Adjutant General shall implement appropriate quarantine procedures, in accordance with established Department of Defense protocols, applicable to all Oklahoma National Guard personnel activated during the COVID-19 response.

The foregoing Orders shall be effective until the end of thirty (30) days after the filing of this Order.

In addition, I hereby declare and order the following:

1. Pursuant to the power and authority vested in me by Section 7 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution, I hereby convoke the First Special Session of the 57th Legislature to reconvene at the State Capitol at 8:00am Central Daylight Time on the second business day following the date of this Order, for the sole purpose of concurring with or terminating this declaration of health emergency.

Copies of this Executive Order shall be distributed to the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma Senate, the Adjutant General of the Oklahoma National Guard, the Oklahoma State Commissioner of Health, the Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety and the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services who shall cause the provisions of this Order to be implemented by all appropriate agencies of State government.

SJR 27—By David and Bergstrom of the Senate and Wallace of the House.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 40 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution; modifying the amounts of certain deposits; specifying purpose of appropriation; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SUBJECT: Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 57TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to Section 40 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution to read as follows:

Section 40. A. There is hereby created a trust fund to be known as the “Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund”. The trust fund principal shall consist of the portion of monies which are received by the State of Oklahoma on or after July 1, 2001, pursuant to any settlement with or judgment against any tobacco company or companies as provided by subsection B of this section, and any other monies that may be appropriated or otherwise directed to the trust fund by the Legislature.

B. 1. Deposits into the trust fund from monies which are received by the State of Oklahoma pursuant to any settlement with or judgment against any tobacco company or companies shall be based on the following schedule:

<u>Fiscal Year</u>	<u>Minimum Percentage of Payments</u>
Ending June 30, 2002	50%
Ending June 30, 2003	55%
Ending June 30, 2004	60%
Ending June 30, 2005	65%
Ending June 30, 2006	70%
Ending June 30, 2007	75%
<u>Ending June 30, 2021, and each fiscal year thereafter</u>	25%

~~2. Deposits into the trust fund in subsequent fiscal years shall never be less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the payments.~~

~~3. The monies received by the State of Oklahoma pursuant to any settlement with or judgment against any tobacco company or companies after June 30, 2001, not deposited into the trust fund as provided in this section, shall be deposited into a special fund established by the Legislature solely for the purpose of receiving the payments; provided, the Legislature may, by law, direct a certain portion of such monies to the Office of the Attorney General. The special fund shall be subject to legislative appropriations and shall be appropriated and expended to draw down federal matching funds for the Medicaid program.~~

C. There is hereby created the Board of Investors of the Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund. The Board of Investors shall have the duty of investing monies in the trust fund, subject to restrictions and limitations provided by law for and in accordance with laws applicable to the investment of monies in state retirement funds.

The Board of Investors shall consist of five (5) members as follows:

1. The State Treasurer who shall be the chair;
2. An appointee of the Governor;
3. An appointee of the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

4. An appointee of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and
5. An appointee of the State Auditor and Inspector.

The initial appointees shall serve staggered terms of office as provided for by law. Thereafter, appointees shall serve four-year terms of office. No more than two appointees shall be appointed from any single congressional district. All appointed members shall have demonstrated expertise in public or private investment funds management.

D. There is hereby created the Board of Directors of the Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund. The Board of Directors shall consist of seven (7) members, one appointed by each of the following appointing authorities:

1. The Governor;
2. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
3. The Speaker of the House of Representatives;
4. The Attorney General;
5. The State Treasurer;
6. The State Auditor and Inspector; and
7. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

The initial appointed members shall serve staggered terms of office as provided for by law. Thereafter, the appointed members of the Board of Directors shall serve seven-year terms of office. At least one appointee shall be appointed from each congressional district, and not more than two appointees shall be appointed from any single congressional district. Not more than four appointees shall be members of the same political party. An appointee shall have been a member of the political party to which the appointee belongs for at least one (1) year prior to the date of appointment. Appointees shall have demonstrated expertise in public or private health care or programs related to or for the benefit of children or senior adults.

The Board of Directors shall meet at least one time each calendar quarter.

E. Earnings from the trust fund, including but not limited to interest, dividends, and realized capital gains from investments of the trust fund shall be expended as provided in subsection F of this section for the following purposes:

1. Clinical and basic research and treatment efforts in Oklahoma for the purpose of enhancing efforts to prevent and combat cancer and other tobacco-related diseases;
2. Cost-effective tobacco prevention and cessation programs;
3. Programs other than those specified in paragraph 1 of this subsection designed to maintain or improve the health of Oklahomans or to enhance the provision of health care services to Oklahomans, with particular emphasis on such programs for children;
4. Programs and services for the benefit of the children of Oklahoma, with particular emphasis on common and higher education, before- and after-school and pre-school programs, substance abuse prevention and treatment programs and other programs and services designed to improve the health and quality of life of children;
5. Programs designed to enhance the health and well-being of senior adults; and
6. Authorized administrative expenses of the Office of the State Treasurer and the Board of Directors.

F. Each fiscal year, the Board of Directors may expend the amount of earnings which actually accrued to the trust fund during the preceding fiscal year. Any amount not so expended shall remain in the trust fund. The Board shall direct specific expenditures to be made for the purposes specified in subsection E of this section.

G. The Legislature may enact laws to further implement the provisions of this section.

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

This measure amends Section 40 of Article 10 of the Oklahoma Constitution. It modifies the amount of the annual tobacco settlement payments to the state to be deposited into the Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust Fund. It modifies the amount of the annual tobacco settlement payments to the state to be deposited into the Tobacco Settlement Fund for appropriation by the Oklahoma Legislature. It specifies that deposits into the Tobacco Settlement Fund shall be appropriated and expended to draw down federal matching funds for the Medicaid program.
